<sup>22</sup> So on the day of the battle not a soldier with Saul and Jonathan had a sword or spear in his hand; only Saul and his son Jonathan had them. <sup>14:1</sup> One day Jonathan son of Saul said to his young armor-bearer, "Come, let's go over to the Philistine outpost on the other side." But he did not tell his father. <sup>2</sup> Saul was staying on the outskirts of Gibeah under a pomegranate tree in Migron. With him were about six hundred men, <sup>3</sup> among whom was Ahijah, who was wearing an ephod. He was a son of Ichabod's brother Ahitub son of Phinehas, the son of Eli, the Lord's priest in Shiloh. No one was aware that Jonathan had left. <sup>4</sup> On each side of the pass that Jonathan intended to cross to reach the Philistine outpost was a cliff; one was called Bozez and the other Seneh. <sup>5</sup> One cliff stood to the north toward Mikdash, the other to the south toward Geba. <sup>6</sup> Jonathan said to his young armor-bearer, "Come, let's go over to the outpost of those uncircumcised men. **Perhaps the Lord will act in our behalf. Nothing can hinder the Lord from saving, whether by many or by few.**" <sup>7</sup> "Do all that you have in mind," his armor-bearer said.
