Baseline of Generosity – The Tithe

⁸ Will man rob God? Yet you are robbing me. But you say, 'How have we robbed you?' In your tithes and contributions.

⁹ You are cursed with a curse, for you are robbing me, the whole nation of you. ¹⁰ Bring the full tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. And thereby put me to the test, says the LORD of hosts, if I will not open the windows of heaven for you and pour down for you a blessing until there is no more need. (Malachi 3:8-10, ESV)

Blessing of Generosity – Giving Away Excess

"I believe that we are destined to be remembered by the wounds, the brokenness and that lack of wholeness unless we come to grips with and become grateful people."

Whoever gives to the poor will not want, but he who hides his eyes will get many a curse. (Proverbs 28:27, ESV)

The generous will themselves be blessed, for they share their food with the poor. (Proverbs 22:9, NIV)

Outbursts of Generosity – I've Seen Fire and I've Seen Rain!

²⁰ So Ahab sent to all the people of Israel and gathered the prophets together at Mount Carmel. ²¹ And Elijah came near to all the people and said, "How long will you go limping between two different opinions? If the LORD is God, follow him; but if Baal, then follow him." And the people did not answer him a word. ²² Then Elijah said to the people, "I, even I only, am left a prophet of the LORD, but Baal's prophets are 450 men. ²³ Let two bulls be given to us, and let them choose one bull for themselves and cut it in pieces and lay it on the wood, but put no fire to it. And I will prepare the other bull and lay it on the wood and put no fire to it. ²⁴ And you call upon the name of your god, and I will call upon the name of the LORD, and the God who answers by fire, he is God." And all the people answered, "It is well spoken."
